He is the only author ever to have been a number one bestseller in fiction (twenty-one times), short stories (four times) and non-fiction (The Prison Diaries). With a writing career spanning 44 years, Jeffrey has produced 42 works. Starting in 2020, he is publishing four new William Warwick novels, one set of short stories and three updated works for children.

Jeffrey has been married for 54 years to Dame Mary Archer, who was Chair of Cambridge University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust and is the current Chair of the Science Museum Group.

They have two sons, William and James, three grandsons and two granddaughters, and divide their time between homes in London, Cambridge and Mallorca.

Hell, the first volume in Archer's The Prison Diaries, is the author's daily record of the time he spent there.
